The asset allocation of the fund will be varied according to the manager's view on the macroeconomic outlook as well as the attractiveness of each asset class. Investments to be included in the Engelberg IP Balanced Fund will, apart from assets in liquid form, consist of securities across the equity, fixed interest and property markets, including securities which provide exposure commodities, exchange traded funds and exchange traded notes as permitted by legislation from time to time. The investment manager will have complete flexibility to vary the exposure to different asset classes as economic conditions vary.

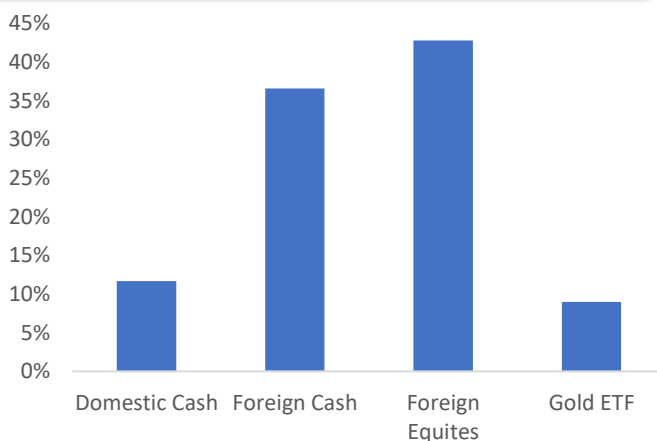
## About the portfolio manager

**ENGELBERG IP BALANCED FUND A CLASS:** From 28 July 2017 to 31 December 2020 1,95% (Total Expense Ratio) of the value of the financial product was incurred as expenses relating to administration of the portfolio. 0,65% (Transaction Costs) of the value of the financial product was incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the asset underlying the portfolio. Therefore 2,60% (Total Investment Charge) of the value of the financial product was incurred as costs relating to the investment of the financial product.

## Portfolio manager's comment

April saw global equities continue to rise, supported by stimulus measures and the acceleration of vaccine rollouts. The US recorded positive economic data and corporate earnings beat expectations. The S&P500 and Nasdaq gained over 5% for the month, the Dow Jones Industrial Average gained 2.70%. The rotation from pandemic beneficiary growth stocks to more cyclically orientated stocks is still in effect as investors anticipate lockdown easing to continue. US Treasuries continue to offer negative real yields across most of the yield curve which has benefited gold. Inflation has been a concern due to the excessive stimulus in the system and deglobalization, this can be seen in commodity and other input costs. Emerging markets lagged developed markets. India recorded a second wave of covid-19 which grabbed headlines as the country's healthcare infrastructure reached its limits. Locally, the JSE was largely flat gaining 0,68% for the month. Resources gained 2,70%, Industrials lost 1,33%, Listed Property outperformed returning 9.95% and Financials were largely flat at 0,55% for the month. The SARB kept interest rates unchanged at 3.5% to help boost the economy. SA government bonds have started attracting foreign investors due to the high yields on offer compared to other countries.

## Additional fund information

- The annual fees for the A class referred to above includes an annual fee of 1,15% (including VAT) payable to IP Management Company and Engelberg.
- The fund can move freely between different asset classes.
- The fund manager may borrow up to 10% of the market value of the portfolio to bridge insufficient liquidity.
